**FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT**

Russian language proficiency exam

Must demonstrate proficiency in **one of the two** languages listed below.

German foreign language (must satisfy either option 1 or option 2)

- Option 1: Passed German reading exam
- Option 2: Completed German 5 with a "B" or better

French foreign language (must satisfy either option 1 or option 2)

- Option 1: Passed French reading exam
- Option 2: Completed French 5 with a "B" or better

Slavic 200A: Literary Proseminar

Slavic 201: Introduction to Old Church Slavic

Russian 220A: Structure of Modern Russian

Russian 211A: Literature of Medieval Rus'

Russian 211B: 18th-Century Russian Literature

Russian 212A: 19th-Century Russian Literature (Golden Age)

Russian 212B: 19th-Century Russian Literature (Age of Realism)

Russian 213A: 20th-Century Russian Literature, 1890 to 1929

Russian 213B: 20th-Century Russian Literature, 1930 to 1989

Additional 4-unit course of 200-level in Russian language & literature.

*\*Please note that courses in the 500 series may NOT be applied toward the MA requirements.*

**COMPREHENSIVE EXAMINATION PLAN**

- Research paper (approx. 7000 words) due 10th week of quarter prior to quarter of MA exams
- Submit application for advancement to MA candidacy no later than 2nd week of quarter in which the MA exams are to be taken. Student must have passed foreign language requirement and research paper requirement before s/he takes his MA exams.
