Summer Language Study Grants

Fulbright-Hays Doctoral Dissertation Research Abroad (DDRA)

The DDRA program provides opportunities to doctoral candidates to engage in full-time dissertation research abroad in modern foreign languages and area studies. The program is particularly interested in funding "A research project conducted in the field of science, technology, engineering, mathematics, computer science, education (comparative or international), international development, political science, public health, or economics." The project dates are October 1, 2018 through March 31, 2020. DDRA research projects may be any consecutive 6-12 months during that period.

Basic Requirements:

- must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident at time of application
- be advanced to doctoral candidacy before your award begins
- be studying a modern language or area studies
- be proficient in the language(s) necessary to carry out your research
- planning a teaching career in the U.S. upon completion of doctoral program
