WRITTEN AND ORAL QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS (ON BACK OF FORM)

(BEFORE) WRITTEN AND ORAL QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS

- Formed a committee of four faculty members among whom must hold current UCLA faculty appointments (with permission, one can be from outside the University if properly credentialed). The Chair of your committee must be from the department. YOU must ask each committee member and receive his/her permission before adding him/her to your committee!
- Consulted with departmental counselor to complete committee nomination paperwork (this must happen at least 2 months prior to taking exams).
- Consulted with your advisor and your committee members to make sure you are sufficiently prepared before taking exams.
- Scheduled dates and times for your written and oral exams.

(AFTER PASSING) WRITTEN AND ORAL QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS

- Consulted with departmental counselor to complete advancement to candidacy paperwork.
- Submit prospectus within one quarter after passing oral qualifying examination.
- Present paper at California Slavic Colloquium no later than two calendar years after advancement to candidacy.
- Dissertation.
